



Bob and I founded the Tribeca Film Festival out of the ashes of the attacks of 9/11. We needed to do something to help our city fight fear and hatred. We needed to bring people back downtown. We're movie people, and so we did what we do best: we put on a show. We never imagined how the Festival would grow, but we believed then what we still hold true today: stories are the most effective tools we have to entertain, to educate, to inspire, to heal, and to bring us together.

Today, the Tribeca Film Festival continues to champion new voices and honor established storytellers, from Philip Youmans, who directed *Burning Cane* when he was seventeen, to one of film's luminaries, Francis Ford Coppola, who will premiere the restoration of his 1979 masterpiece, *Apocalypse Now*. We are platform-agnostic, and celebrate innovative work across film, television, mixed reality, gaming, music, online platforms, and more. For years, Tribeca's immersive program has been at the forefront of showcasing and sharing new storytelling technologies. We give our audience access to the cutting edge. We aim to expand the way we tell stories, and the way we see them, too.

The impulse of activism that founded the Festival is part of our DNA and informs us daily. The Tribeca Film Festival is still a community event, but even as we celebrate our neighborhood, we bring together diverse artists and audiences from around the world. This year, our programmers watched a total of 9,306 submissions and travelled the globe to over thirty countries in order to curate a vibrant program that will challenge you, entertain you, and take you into uncharted territories. We are proud to introduce Tribeca Critics' Week; an expanded Tribeca X; and a special program, This Used to Be New York. We honor the fiftieth anniversary of the Stonewall Riots with daylong activities at Tribeca Celebrates Pride.

We live in a world with every image at our fingertips and every story seemingly just a click away. It's never been easier to tell our stories, but with so much noise, it can be hard to actually hear each other. Our program aims to elevate the experience of watching films by understanding these stories as part of a conversation. Tribeca 2019 gathers together a global community of storytellers. The artist's voice resonates through our program. Once again, the Tribeca Film Festival provides a space to share our stories, and to listen to each other.



America's independence isn't the only reason to celebrate on the 4th of July. For residents and visitors on Coney Island, the date is synonymous with the nationally televised Nathan's Famous Hot Dog Eating Contest, a.k.a. the "Super Bowl of competitive eating." The annual frankfurter consumption extravaganza even has its own "Magic versus Bird": Japan's Takeru "Kobi" Kobayashi and Californian Joey Chestnut. Their rivalry is deeper than cooked franks and water-drenched buns. Kobi and Joey's competition is the stuff of vintage sporting drama, hot dogs and all, tackling personal challenges and questions about what it means to be an "American hero."

In this documentary, filmmaker **Nicole Lucas Haimes** analyzes competitive eating's most storied pair through lively and candid interviews with both competitors. She approaches an event that—let's be frank—isn't taken seriously by most people with earnestness and wide-eyed fascination, constructing both an insightful primer on a niche sport and an endearing humanization of two unconventional athletes.

Jack Malik (Himesh Patel, BBC's Eastenders) is a struggling singer-songwriter in a tiny English seaside town whose dreams of fame are rapidly fading, despite the fierce devotion and support of his childhood best friend, Ellie (Lily James, Mamma Mia! Here We Go Again). Then, after a freak bus accident during a mysterious global blackout, Jack wakes up to discover that The Beatles have never existed ... and he finds himself with a very complicated problem, indeed.

Performing songs by the greatest band in history to a world that has never heard them, and with a little help from his steel-hearted American agent, Debra (Emmy winner **Kate McKinnon**), Jack's fame explodes. But as his star rises, he risks losing Ellie—the one person who always believed in him. The Beacon Theatre will be outfitted for this exclusive occasion with Meyer Sound VLFC (Very Low Frequency Control), a ground-breaking loudspeaker system engineered to output audio frequencies below the limits of human hearing, giving the audience a truly visceral experience. In addition, the film has been enhanced with Dolby Vision®, delivering spectacular colors and highlights that are up to 40 times brighter and blacks that are 10 times darker, and Dolby Atmos®, producing moving audio that flows all around you with breathtaking realism.

Reality Bites 25th Anniversary

Winona Ryder and Ethan Hawke star in Ben Stiller's 1994 feature film directorial debut, the iconic comedy-drama that defined a generation of independent moviegoing-and-moviegoers with its achingly-relatable portrait of early 90's disaffected youth struggling to live and love amid the brutal reality of (almost) adulthood.

In the film, written by Helen Childress, Lelaina Pierce (Ryder) navigates her post-college disillusionment by turning the camera on her friends: the free-spirited Vickie (Janeane Garofalo); Sammy (Steve Zahn), struggling to come out to his conservative parents; and the passionate but direction-less Troy (Hawke), with whom Lelaina is romantically-entwined until video executive Michael (Stiller, who costars) arrives with the promise of both budding romance and the chance for Lelaina to cash in on her dreams—but at what expense?

Reality Bites may have been for and about Generation X, but has proven itself a timeless, decades-spanning classic.

Thirty years ago, **Cameron Crowe** shifted the landscape of romantic comedies with his remarkable and deeply felt debut that chronicled, with tender and warm-hearted authenticity, a vivid tale of first love. Charting the blooming romance between recent highschool graduates Lloyd (**John Cusack**) and Diane (**Ione Sky**), Crowe gave audiences one of cinema's most indelible and enduring romantic movie moments: a lovesick boy, standing outside a girl's window, asking her to love him with the help of Peter Gabriel and a boombox. Three decades later, *Say Anything...* continues to give off the affectionate, enveloping glow of first love.



Blow the Man Down

The Connolly Sisters (Sophie Lowe and Morgan Saylor) are in mourning, but between a dead stranger in the ocean, a missing murder weapon, and the increasingly shady behavior of their recently deceased mom's friends, they've barely had a chance to register their loss. The audacious debut feature from codirectors and screenwriters Bridget Savage Cole and Danielle Krudy blends elements of thriller and the darkest of comedies to present something wholly entertaining and wickedly original.

The film features an outstanding female-led cast including **Annette O'Toole**, **June Squibb**, and an unforgettable performance from **Margo Martindale** as the head of a criminal operation that threatens to uncover the surprising underbelly of their idyllic seaside New England town. Gorgeously photographed, and punctuated by a set of stunningly surreal sea shanties courtesy of the film's version of a Greek chorus, Krudy and Savage Cole create a true ensemble piece in the vein of classic Coen Brothers. The film heralds a new pair of cinematic voices that won't soon be forgotten.

Burning Cane

DIRECTED BY PHILLIP YOUMANS

A worried mother (Karen Kaia Livers) caring for her mange-ridden family dog; her unemployed, alcoholic son (Dominique McClellan) and the wife (Emyri Crutchfield) who supports him; and a preacher (Wendell Pierce) whose wife's recent death has pushed him toward the bottle are a few of the characters who make up the beautifully rich world of Southeastern Louisiana in Phillip Youmans' extraordinary debut feature, Burning Cane. The poetic lyricism of the film's handheld camerawork calls to mind a Terrence Malick-like interest in the influence of place on the people who inhabit it, and how deeply the beauty of the natural world can contrast with the brutality of human acts. As one of the principal embodiments of this contradiction, Pierce gives a powerful performance as the preacher who is struggling to both help his flock as well as himself.

Youmans imbues his film about a group of flawed individuals with a soulful empathy that belies his age. (He was finishing the film around the same time as he was finishing high school.) *Burning Cane*, executive produced by **Benh Zeitlin**, signals him as a director to watch.

In this moody and mysterious narrative feature, a scenic lake house becomes a sanctuary for two young women. Karen (Otmara Marrero), 29, is just out of a long-term relationship and needing a place to lick her wounds, so she sneaks into her ex's summer home. There she meets the precocious Lana (Sydney Sweeney), whose bold charisma is a welcome distraction. Both Karen and Lana are emotionally guarded, but their cautious flirtation brings each of them a sense of validation.

Sweeney and Marrero deliver hypnotic performances laced with intimacy. Equal parts psychological drama and sexual coming-of-age story, *Clementine* is a rumination on who we choose to love and how to let go. It's a beautifully-rendered debut, marking the discovery of an exciting new female filmmaker.

Traumatized by troubled family relationships and socioeconomic hardships, they seek escape through video games, doing drugs, and hard partying, which provide only a temporary relief from their pain. After a shattering and unexpected discovery, the boys further lose touch with reality and lash out through dangerous acts of violence and revenge that lead to an uncertain future.

Gully marks the feature debut of acclaimed music video director Nabil Elderkin, who uses stylized cinematography and surrealistic elements to craft his vision of a community in chaos. Featuring strong supporting turns from Terrence Howard, Amber Heard, Robin Givens, and John Corbett, along with a cameo by Travis Scott, this film is a gritty, deeply affecting, coming-of-age drama that channels rage in unforgettable fashion.

"Struggling actor" is a generous way to think of Sergio Garces (Diego Peretti)—he's closer to a prolific featured extra. On top of that, he's having the unluckiest few days of his life. After pushing someone out of a window in the heat of a scuffle, he's sentenced to probation and anger management training. Then, a bike accident busts his nose to the point that he can only "appear" onscreen in virtual reality porn. All the same, Sergio exudes an enticing charisma, a rumpled cool—an aura that led him to record covers of Serge Gainsbourg, to whom he bears more than a passing resemblance. He hooks up with a thrill-seeking American sales agent (Julianne Nicholson) in town for a film festival, but their dreams of adventure only escalate the trouble.

Like Sergio's covers, *Initials SG* riffs on classic cool, nodding to *Goodfellas*, *Breathless*, and the effortlessly chic sensuality of an icon like Gainsbourg. From these reference points, co-directors **Rania Attieh** and **Daniel Garcia** create a world that is entirely their own, toggling between deadbeat dramedy, crime caper, and even surreal bouts of black comedy. Their body of work, which has taken them from Attieh's home city of Tripoli in *OK*, *Almost*, *Goodbye* to an apocalyptic upstate New York in *H.*, lets setting create the mood. Here, Buenos Aires is laid-back and rhythmic, the perfect backdrop for Sergio's dreamy, stylish, and, frankly, weed-induced head trip.

An original take on a buried treasure story, the feature marries a gritty tale of thrills and double crosses with an Amblinesque adventure story. Surprising at every turn, and overlaid with the palpable weight of a hot summer day, *Low Tide* represents an exciting new voice and cast of newcomers.

It is this simple, but unanswerable question from a precocious three-year old that kicks off an epic journey as the small lad leads his family on an imaginative adventure through fantastic lands filled with mythic creatures. Told through the eyes of both the father (Mark Webber), battling a terminal illness, and his young son (Bodhi Palmer), The Place Of No Words story moves seamlessly between the world as we know it and a shared fantasy, exploring the laughter and pain, fear and wonder that people experience as they confront and cope with death.

Webber, serving as writer, director, and star of his magical realist fable, creates a vividly intimate, lived-in realism that finds a beautiful counterpoint in the bold, epic imagery of the fantasy. Palmer (the real-life son of Webber and Teresa Palmer, who also stars) gives a remarkably open performance as the child who—even in a land of make-believe—is forced to confront a difficult reality. Ultimately, The Place Of No Words is a poignant reminder that even though the question is unanswerable, it isn't one to confront with fear.

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Stray Dolls

Early in Stray Dolls, a passport is unceremoniously shredded unbeknownst to its owner, Riz (Geetanjali Thapa), an action that stands in stark contrast to the owner's hopes for a new beginning. This duality propels the action of Sonejuhi Sinha's moody and atmospheric thriller. Leaving India behind to break with a life of petty crime, Riz arrives stateside and gets a housekeeping job at the decidedly landlocked Tides Plaza Motel. Its manager Una (Cynthia Nixon) houses and employs several other young people in dire straits, including Dallas (Olivia DeJonge), Riz's new roommate. At first antagonistic, the girls soon realize that their opposite personalities complement each other. Dallas is a bit of a wild card, hooking up with a skeezy dealer (Robert Aramayo) who is also Una's son, whereas Riz is guarded but stolid, reluctant to take any route forward that isn't entirely legal.

Sinha's style is seductive and sensory, swathed in vibrant gel lights and rushes of primal tactility, which she uses to keep motivations and actions murky. She immerses her characters in a dense fog, the safest direction unknown and notions of "right" and "wrong" becoming increasingly irrelevant.

For teenage Nola (**Sabrina Carpenter**), home is the open road. Her self-reliant father (**Steven Ogg**) is her anchor in a life of transience. The pair criss-cross the United States in a lovingly refurbished RV, making ends meet through odd jobs while relishing their independence.

A shocking rupture, though, casts Nola out on her own. She makes her way to Albuquerque, New Mexico in search of a mother she never knew, only for her motorhome to break down unexpectedly. But after forging a bond with an auto body shop owner (**Danny Trejo**), Nola senses the possibility of mooring her ship in this storm.

With an eye for quiet detail, Ani Simon-Kennedy emphasizes the precariousness of young people surviving on the fringes of a country ravaged by income inequality. This unforgiving backdrop makes The Short History Of The Long Road's hope for Nola all the more moving and a poignant coming of age tale. It is ultimately Carpenter's movie: she sinks into Nola's wise but searching old soul in a breakout performance, endearingly detailed and compellingly internal.

When the Supreme Court legalized marriage equality across the nation in 2015, many assumed that the fight for LGBTQ rights was won. But politicians and religious conservatives launched a state-by-state campaign to retract the human rights of America's LGBTQ citizens under the guise of religious freedom. Introducing four American families caught in the crosshairs of scripture, sexuality, and identity, this documentary weaves together clips from the national news and the church pulpit, alongside family photos and intimate testimonies to show the undeniable connection between the personal and the political.

These individual experiences of rejection and validation, tragedy and triumph include Ryan Robertson, who was encouraged by his Christian family to attend conversion therapy; Sarah McBride, the transgender student body president who went on to work at the White House; Vico Báez Febo, whose Catholic grandmother locked him out of the house when a neighbor outed him; and Elliot Porcher, a young trans man who endured self-harm before his parents' acceptance enabled him to come to terms with his gender. An emotionally impactful follow-up to the award-winning For The Bible Tells Me So, this powerful examination of the intersection of religion, sexual orientation, and gender identity offers much-needed healing, clarity, and understanding.

"You are not beautiful..." a dating counselor bluntly states to 34-year-old Beijing lawyer **Qiu Hua Mei** in a soul-crushing interview, while suggesting she lower her standards—finding an educated man who respects women is unrealistic. HuaMei is one of the millions whom the Chinese government labels sheng nu, "leftover ladies" who haven't married by age 27. Similarly stymied are **Xu Min**, a 28-year-old who lives at home with her exacting mother who disapproves of her prospects, and 36-year-old **Gai Qi**, who is dating a younger man even those she knows that his family won't accept her.

China's one-child policy has created an untenable situation for many stigmatized single women who are under immense pressure from society, from families afraid of losing face, and from a government desperate to maintain population numbers. Filmmakers **Shosh Shlam** and **Hilla Medalia** explore this phenomenon, from the spectacle of awkward public dating contests and government sponsored matchmaking festivals to parents' marriage markets and excruciating family encounters. *Leftover Women* is a poignant and ultimately hopeful profile of three brave women seeking to define life and love on their own terms.

Through a treasure trove of rarely seen archival footage and insights from those closest to Hutchence, director **Richard Lowenstein** creates a documentary that is both kinetic and intimate, delving into the singer's complicated upbringing, his rise to fame, the devoted love affairs with women such as **Helena Christensen**, **Kylie Minogue**, and **Paula Yates**, a growing drug problem, the traumatic brain injury that changed the course of his life, and his never-ending struggle to make peace with himself.

Chinese artist **Maleonn** creates elaborate photo tableaus that blend the real and the surreal in ways that echo his own memories. He follows in the artistic footsteps of his parents: his mother was an actress and his father, **Ma Ke**, was a long time director of the Peking Opera Theater. Maleonn is excited to collaborate with his father on his new project, a theater production of an intricately-designed father and son machine puppet. His father, however, is in the early stages of Alzheimer's and slowly forgetting his past.

Through the lens of a father-son relationship, Our Time Machine is the story of what it means to be an artist in China in the 20th century and today. Scheme Birds centers on Scottish teenager Gemma and the people in her life: her grandfather, who raised her after her mother abandoned her; her boyfriend Pat; her unlucky best friend Amy; and her neighbor JP. Their scheme is Jerviston, a place where you "either get knocked up or locked up," where there's been nothing to do since Margaret Thatcher closed the local steelworks in the 1980s. Everyone finds a distraction to stay out of trouble: Papa keeps pigeons and teaches boxing, the kids drink and commit petty crime, and Gemma finds motherhood.

Directors **Ellen Fiske** and **Ellinor Hallin** paint an intimate portrait of this fading town, and of Gemma as she comes of age in a place scarred by society's broken promises. But Gemma's tenacity and determination shine through her surroundings. Her budding voice accompanies the film's dreamy cinematography, providing a chilling commentary on the violence and loneliness all around her. Thanks to the sensitivity of the filmmakers, and Gemma's strong personality, there is a clear strand of hope in this absorbing story of survival.

At first, McConnell views pregnancy as a practical choice, but once he stops taking testosterone, it prompts an unexpected reckoning with his relationship to masculinity and gender presentation. Feeling as though he's slipping away from his own body, Freddy navigates steep clinic bills, conversational micro-aggressions, and familial strain. Yet, his resolve to start a family never wavers.

Finlay rides sidecar with McConnell as an incisive observer and conversation partner, and crafts a compassionate portrait of an extraordinary journey, in which the word fatherhood comes to embody so much more than the normative sum of its parts.

Questions of excess and principle are already in play when private-practice clinician Niri (Lima Das) goes out of her way to treat a patient's emergency bout of nausea. Rather than food poisoning, she attributes his extreme illness to recklessly gorging himself. When debriefing with his friend Sumon (Arghadeep Barua) afterwards, Niri learns that both of them belong to a club dedicated to preparing fresh, rather than processed, meat, and that Sumon's dissertation even focuses on regional meateating traditions across India. Sparks fly, but Niri is married, although her husband, also a doctor, is often absent for field work.

The pair's mounting, unvoiced desire sets the stakes for Aamis, in which surface-level innocence becomes loaded with a significance beyond control. Through initially innocuous text conversations, Sumon and Niri grow closer, and begin to explore their blossoming connection through excursions to restaurants, in search of increasingly niche meat-based delicacies. In a patient and understated build, Bhaskar Hazarika folds in class commentary and dreamlike interludes, but saves the film's most surprising and shocking gambit—and aftermath—for the third act, capping off an unforgettable meditation on taboo and transgression.

It's in her cram school professor (Saebyuk Kim), however, that Eunheen finds the answers that she seeks, as the two form an unlikely friendship.

In her feature debut, **Bora Kim** puts Korean culture and mores on display, gently criticizing the reduced role where women are pressured to exist. The film's measured pace allows it to examine the many moments between despair, contrasting the joy of adolescence with its miseries. Bora Kim presents an honest and poignant take on youth, filled with warm cinematography from **Gookhyun** and introduces a powerhouse performance from the young Ji-hu Park. An assured debut, *House of Hummingbird* cements Kim's place as an upcoming auteur to follow.

Soon after they arrive, Ömer realizes that there's more to this request than meets the eye: Ibrahim wants to be buried beneath a tree he planted as a boy. In the aftermath of a land dispute that cast Ibrahim's family away from the community 45 years earlier, however, the plot of land has become a holy site called the "Noah Tree," named for the Biblical figure whom they believe first planted it after the Flood. With all relevant public archives damaged, and villagers growing defensive over what seems a sacrilegious project, Ibrahim forges ahead in the name of justice; Ömer, on the other hand, grows conflicted, bearing the brunt of this battle even as he grapples with unaired grievances between himself and his dad.

A thoughtful and deeply felt debut from **Cenk Ertürk**, *Noah Land* probes ethical questions about the price of victory while weighing a human tendency to react in extremes. As Ömer and Ibrahim begin to open up to each other, it also becomes a story about good faith—both in terms of trusting another's intentions and trusting one's own.

A Regular Woman Nur Eine Frau

Inspired by tragic real-life events, *A Regular Woman* introduces audiences to Hatun "Aynur" Sürücü (**Almila Bagriacik**), a vibrant young Turkish woman and mother who was coming into her own in Berlin when she was murdered at 23 by her youngest brother in an honor killing. Forced into an abusive arranged marriage with a cousin in Istanbul at 16 by her devout Muslim family, Anyur escapes to Berlin and gives birth to a son. She is considered a disgraceful burden by her parents and siblings, so Anyur soon leaves her family and attempts to start a new life.

Director **Sherry Hormann**'s unflinching film tells Anyur's story from the character's point of view, giving her a voice she never had. Anyur's narrative voice also reveals the effect of her decisions on her family, rendering the extreme actions that they take in the name of "honor" understandable but no less horrible. Blending stark cinematography with beautiful still imagery (with some pictures featuring the real Hatun "Aynur" Sürücü), *A Regular Woman* is a unique non-fiction narrative anchored by Bagriacik's riveting performance.

Joining forces with William (**Stéphane Bak**), the two 17 year olds hit the road in an impromptu border-crossing adventure.

The boisterous Gyllen and the thoughtful, undocumented William make an unlikely duo. Visiting from the Congo, William is headed to a French refugee camp to look for his missing brother and is trying to stay under the radar. But it doesn't take long for their personalities to rub off on each other and they soon cheerfully dub themselves "Team Crazy, Risky, Stupid." The film is a spirited portrayal of two vulnerable young men struggling to step into their adult selves without the security of family to ground them or male role models to emulate. Capturing with acute sensitivity what it means to live on the margins of mainstream society, the insightful script and poignant performances strike a hopeful tone.

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

Run

Living with his family in the Scottish town of Fraserburgh, Finnie (Mark Stanley) has a lot on his mind. Intimacy with his wife, Katie (Amy Manson), is strained. His teenage son, Kid (Anders Hayward), works with Finnie at the local docks and recently learned that his girlfriend, Kelly (Marli Siu), is pregnant. Finnie fears that Kid is en route to a life similar to his own. One night, looking for a release, Finnie takes Kid's car out for a spin, leading to a case of mistaken identity that results in Kelly unexpectedly riding shotgun. A former street racer, Finnie decides that he and Kelly should liven the evening up with some racing, a decision that will have heavy ramifications for not only Finnie, but also his family.

British director **Scott Graham**'s *Run* is an authentic and taut piece of stripped-down filmmaking, viscerally capturing the desperation of blue-collar anxiety. While the scale is small and personal, the emotional stakes never feel less than overwhelming. Thanks to *Game of Thrones*' actor Stanley's intense performance as Finnie, *Run* takes a hard look at father/son struggles and small-town suffocation, pulling no punches on both fronts.

When Claire (Lou de Laâge), a beautiful but reserved young woman unwittingly provokes the furious jealousy of her evil stepmother Maud (Isabelle Huppert), life as she knows it is over. Sent far away from home, Claire awakens, both figuratively and literally, in a small village in the French mountains. As if by magic, her formerly shy demeanor is gone and she is suddenly aware of her feminine power. It's the beginning of a radical emancipation. As Claire meets the locals and starts to take joy in her sexuality, soon one, two, three... seven men fall under her charm. For the first time in her life she allows herself to include in no-strings sex, taking pride in belonging to no one. But then Maud arrives wanting to reconnect, and Claire must decide who to trust—her sophisticated but cold stepmother, or the circle of adoring men that now surround her.

This latest film from director **Anne Fontaine** has the picturesque look of a storybook but beneath the elegant visuals is a sensual dark comedy about female liberation. Huppert delivers a fascinating portrait of a mother threatened by the sexual freedom of the millennial woman. And de Laâge is a revelation as Claire, the insouciant heroine of this carnal contemporary fairy tale.

Produced by Elevation Pictures, Killer Films (Colette, Carol) and First Generation Films, and adapted from **Susan Choi**'s celebrated novel, American Woman is a reimagining of one of the most astonishing segments of American history. Capturing the era's politics with thoughtful authenticity, Chellas explores the complex psychology of the young radicals, conveying the intensity and isolation of their precarious situation as they both question their beliefs and alliances. Chau (Downsizing, Driveways) and Gadon (True Detective) star as the troubled, idealistic pair.

Charlie Says, directed by masterful filmmaker Mary Harron and written by Guinevere Turner, tells the familiar story through fresh eyes—those of Manson's most devoted girls, van Houten (Game of Thrones' Hannah Murray), Patricia Krenwinkel (Sosie Bacon), and Susan Atkins (Marianne Rendón). Thanks to a devoted prison educator who slowly draws the women out from years of a madman's mesmerizing and abusive spell (Matt Smith), the women's story is told in eerily detailed flashbacks, forcing them to reflect on the path that lead them to such unforgiveable crimes.

After five people are killed during a holdup in a nearby town and a \$20,000 bounty is placed for the capture of the bank robber Allison Wells (**Margot Robbie**), he sees an opportunity—one that's more in his grasp than he ever imagined when he finds her hiding out in the family barn but nigh impossible when he becomes smitten with her.

In this tense, entertaining film with a strong period feel, Robbie's balance of allure and toughness with an underlying manipulation plays well with Cole's hunky innocence and budding manliness. The dreamlands Eugene and Allison seek appear to be at their tips of their fingers until he slowly realizes there is much, much more to her than meets the eye.

Featuring one of the most notorious serial killers of all time, Extremely Wicked, Shockingly Evil And Vile charts the double life of Ted Bundy (Zac Efron). Told from the perspective of Bundy's long-term girlfriend Liz Kloepfer (Lily Collins), the film explores how a smoothtalking, handsome murderer was able to charm so many while leaving a trail of bodies in his wake. As Bundy is charged with increasingly grotesque crimes and plays a game of cat and mouse with authorities across several state lines, Kloepfer is left alone to consider the truth about the love of her life.

The violence remains mostly off screen in Joe Berlinger's finely paced film. With a script based on Kloepfer's real life memoir *The Phantom Prince: My Life With Ted Bundy*, the camera focuses on the domestic bliss of Liz and Ted before things unravel. Collins breathes a steely strength into her nuanced portrayal of a single-mother living with a monster, while Efron's performance is masterful, exploring the full range of Bundy's charm and malice. With a scene-stealing cameo from John Malkovich, *Extremely Wicked, Shockingly Evil And Vile* is full of surprises, gripping the viewer until the final frame.

Mott has a knack for making himself indispensable and impossible to ignore whether it is as an intern, the perfect host, or a Brigadier General of the Iraqi Special Forces. He has an impeccable sense for when to flatter and how to deftly use political jargon to his advantage. The only one seemingly immune to his charms is Elsa's daughter, Amanda (Annette Bening), who might simply disapprove of her mother marrying a much younger man or perhaps she senses something more sinister beneath the smoothtalking surface.

Waltz, in his directorial debut, Redgrave, and Bening form an electrifying trio who pull the viewer into this fascinating and layered world. The mystery hinges on Mott, who is either a misunderstood political genius or a calculating charlatan. Or, possibly, both.

Instead of fighting in person, they begin a daily ritual of passive aggressive but canny note writing that, slowly but surely, edges them nearer to understanding.

In her feature debut, **Dolly Wells** crafts a contemporary, sharp-witted comedy starring her frequent collaborator Mortimer and talented newcomer, Van Patten. Cameos from **Jonathan Ames, Martin Amis**, and **Zadie Smith** add a particularly special layer of authenticity to this tale of two women whose eccentricities unexpectedly draw out change and growth in the other.

Based on the film of the same name that won Best Documentary at Tribeca in 2013, Dan Krauss returns as director of the harrowing narrative version of the story he first brought to the screen. Set in 2010, Private Andrew Briggman (Nat Wolff) is an ambitious infantryman recently sent to Afghanistan. He strives to stand out among the frequently wild but seemingly loveable and loyal brothers of his platoon. When the leader of their group is suddenly replaced, Andrew finds inspiration in the arrival of a new officer in charge, an implacable yet clearly perceptive soldier (Alexander Skarsgård). As Briggman attempts to find his place as a second-in-command, he begins to take note of inhumane treatment and acts of torture against Afghan civilians that in no way line up with the group's mission—or the ethics of the United States military. Not wanting to believe the things he observes, Briggman must choose between reporting his team to authorities—putting his own life immediately in danger—or silently participating in their shocking crimes.

In *The Kill Team*, Krauss expertly directs a talented group of actors who authentically and faithfully portray these real-life figures involved with the infamous Maywand District Murders.

A handheld camera adds to the naturalistic cinematography, which creates the perfect look and atmosphere for **Katharine O'Brien**'s intimate character study and intense look at the devastating impact of mental illness when help is nearly impossible to find. Featuring **Bria Vinaite** and Tribeca alum **Robert Schwartzman** (*Dreamland*), the film allows **Alexandra Daddario** to shine in a fun, supporting turn as a spoiled pop princess.

During a hectic summer that amounts to roughly one wedding per weekend, two jaded college buddies Ben and Alice (Jack Quaid and Maya Erskine) make a pact to survive the onslaught together. As they craft, deliver, and sit through cringe-inducing toast after toast to legions of newly married friends and family (including Ben's dad, an enjoyable Ed Begley Jr.), they shuttle through singles tables in search of fellow lonelyhearts or at least temporary distractions.

Co-directors Jeff Chan and Andrew Rhymer have crafted a hilariously relatable alcohol and insecurity-laden world where sincere affection and real feelings nevertheless shine through. The sparkling chemistry and witty banter between Quaid and Erskine anchor their rollercoaster of a relationship as they move between desperation, elation, denial, and horniness. A fresh rom-com for anyone who has ever been banished to the singles table.

His father (Richard Schiff) is supportive but distant, trying to balance his adult children with his new wife and young son. Josh's aunt just skipped town, and his sister (Kate Berlant) might need to lay off the pills. Everyone convenes at the hospital, trying to give and find support in the face of uncertainty.

Josh begins to listen in earnest and think beyond himself as he confronts these divides. Tribeca alum **Daniel Schechter**'s (*Supporting Characters*, *Life of Crime*) good-natured New York City comedy explores how people face the modern crises in their lives—both natural and self-inflicted.

Tribeca alum Erin Lee Carr's At the Heart of Gold outlines the modern USA Gymnastics apparatus. from Svengalian husband-and-wife coaching team Bela and Martha Karolyi as rulers of a severe training camp to the countless officials, like those at Michigan State University, who enabled and covered up the sexual abuse of hundreds of young women by USA Gymnastics national team doctor Larry Nassar. Through detailed archival footage, revealing first-person interviews with key players, and excerpts of the heartbreaking victim impact statements delivered by 150 women in Michigan state Judge Rosemarie Aquilina's court during Nassar's trial, the film serves as an indictment of the systematic consumption of the labor of young women for the benefit of powerful adults and a corrupt institution.

The narrative centers around current and former gymnasts who trained, competed, and won titles and medals, and bolstered the coffers of USA Gymnastics. At the Heart of Gold follows the money and it leads to the abuse of the bodies of young girls deemed disposable. But the film also highlights their efforts to fight back and earn the most important title of their lives: survivor.

Many speculated Lopez would go straight from high school to the NBA, becoming the ultimate success story for children of the working class. With his community piling their hopes and dreams upon his back, Lopez chose to pursue education over fame, attending St. John's University. This major life decision, made at such a young age, would go on to affect the rest of Lopez's career.

In *The Dominican Dream*, Lopez humbly reflects on the challenges of being the prodigal son and the importance of lifting up the next generation. Featuring interviews with **Allen Iverson**, Alex **Rodriguez**, and **Zendon Hamilton**, the film is an intimate portrait of community, family, and altruism. Imbued with Lopez's optimism and humor, *The Dominican Dream* is a celebration of self-discovery.

DeLorean's rise at GM began with the immediate success of the GTO but he ticked off the suits with his flamboyant style and attitude that eventually forced him out. He was free to develop and build his titular dream car, which debuted in 1981. Amid an economic recession, poor business decisions, mismanagement, and his air of invincibility, the company flopped, which led to his infamous coke bust and the revelations of theft.

Dan Argott and Sheena Joyce provide a variety of insights from those who worked with him at GM and DeLorean, assembly line workers at the Northern Ireland DeLorean plant, his son and daughter, FBI agents, and others close to him. Also providing a fresh perspective is Alec Baldwin, playing the man himself in reenactments of key scenes in his life, adding to a deep portrait of a complex, brilliant innovator, designer, and marketing genius whose Midas touch ultimately and quickly disappeared.

Artfully framed in a narrative recreation starring Tavi **Gevinson**, we begin the story of **Roy Halston** in his early days as the go-to milliner for the rich and famous, most notably as the designer of Jackie Kennedy's sensational pillbox hat. Eventually transitioning to sleek, bias-cut women's wear unlike anything the fashion world had seen, Halston opens his iconic Madison Avenue boutique in 1968. From there, his popularity skyrockets to such epic proportions that his name seems to touch almost every piece of clothing and home good on the market only to crash and burn, as those who find his mass market approach passé abandon him.

But beneath this infamous story of success—and Halston's tempestuous personality—Tcheng digs into the man himself. Most foundationally, he details his clan of legendary models, clients, and lovers, as well as members of his own beloved biological family, represented here in archival footage from the years of his reign. Those familiar with the name but not the details will find the designer's fascinating story a richly entertaining window into fashion, commerce, and human foible.

Like a good use of a chin scratching emoji, the documentary is both thought-provoking and fun, and it will insure that viewers never look at another emoji, or think of language itself, the same way again.



It's an artful, engaging and often amusing cinematic memoir that offers a unique, behind the scenes look at a working class boy raised by his grandmother, who found his home in the band that disrupted the music scene and made rock'n'roll history.

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

Woodstock: Three Days That Defined a Generation

When business partners **John Roberts** and **Joel Rosenman** floated the idea of hosting an opening day party with live music to celebrate their new recording studio in Woodstock, New York, they had no idea what it would eventually become: a pilgrimage of 500,000 like-minded radicals and hippies to **Max Yasgur**'s farm in Bethel, where they would find spiritual reassurance and release in a celebration of freedom.

50 years later, Barak Goodman's electric retelling of the three-day music festival captures the zeitgeist of the time. Structured faithfully around audio testimony from attendees, Woodstock: Three Days That Defined a Generation focuses not just on how it all came to be, despite enormous challenges, but how it felt for it to happen: an endless traffic backup was elevated to a communal experience, and a food shortage became a collaboration rather than a disaster. The incredible performances spotlighted in the film, from **Jimi Hendrix** to Joan Baez to Crosby, Stills, and Nash-form the backdrop to what is fundamentally the audience's story. Woodstock takes us all back to a time and a place now captured in a time capsule, but also reminds us of the immediacy that love, music and shared experience can elicit.

Patiently and empathetically observed, 37 Seconds marks an impressive narrative debut from HIKARI. She gradually expands the scope of Yuma's explorations until her travels take her further than she could ever have anticipated. Although Yuma's search for physical, creative, and sexual autonomy suits a broad canvas, Hikari maintains an intimate focus on her protagonist. Kayama is extraordinary as Yuma, holding the center in what deserves to be a breakout performance.

Featuring a nostalgic dive into their back catalog, it's easy to see the soulful talent that made Blind Melon shine. The film is both an archive of 90s politics and culture, and a philosophical study of fame, inviting the viewer to contemplate the price tag of success.

The film centers on Mack Beggs, who made headlines last year when he became the Texas State Champion in wrestling and was heralded as a hero by some while receiving hate and threats from others.

Trans athletes have to work harder than their cisgender peers in order to thrive in their field while also having the courage and resilience to face daily harassment and discrimination. The kids in this film have found sports as a way to channel the negativity around them into a positive, to gain a sense of self-worth and validation. This film is their urgent, articulate plea for acceptance.

Circus of Books

How do you explain to your friends that your mom and pop run a gay pornography shop? This is just one question that director **Rachel Mason** asks in this intimate and probing documentary. When their medical device company went under, **Karen** and **Barry Mason** needed a source of income to tide them over. They found a temporary gig distributing explicit magazines for publisher **Larry Flynt**. This eventually morphed into a mini adult empire, including the titular retail shop—a fixture on West Hollywood's Santa Monica Boulevard for decades—and later, a hardcore film production company.

Turning the camera on her parents and siblings, Mason explores the contradictions of growing up in an unconventional household where her mom could be found volunteering at her synagogue or re-stocking issues of *Hand Job Magazine*. Sex was never discussed at home, but it was films like *A Rim with a View* that helped put the kids through college. *Circus Of Books* chronicles the Masons and their uncommon journey: obscenity charges during the Reagan era, bearing witness to the AIDS epidemic, and facing financial struggles given their aging customer base. It's an honest and engaging portrait of the legendary X-rated emporium and its unlikely proprietors.

Everything and everyone looks different in the morning light which brings reconciliations and fresh ideas—maybe what Izzy was looking for was in front of her the whole time! It's refreshing to see female sexuality presented in such a light, humorous way, and director **Emily Cohn** captures both the exciting, and the cringey moments all too realistically. The summer ahead looks bright.

This is all put at risk when Lea's ex (Arieh Worthalter) shows up with their six-year old son, Joseph (Vidal Arzoni)—a son that Lea never wanted.

Using smart, engaging cinematography, the film portrays both characters' desperation as they rush around the hotel where the contest takes place, weaving in and out of the bodybuilders preening in every corner, the little boy dwarfed by their colossal limbs. The actors' taut performances augment the controlled emotions surging just below the surface. In a world where every millimeter and every ounce is controlled, and every angle and sequin is scrutinised, Joseph comes in like an unpredictable whirlwind, upsetting Lea's delicate balance between past and future.

The Milwaukee Police Department and FBI jumped swiftly into action, aware of what was at stake of being lost—and that time was of the essence.

Through *Plucked*, director **Joel Van Haren** highlights the vast cultural and historical value of these instruments—and how easily they could be lost forever. Feel the pressure as the authorities work against the clock and try to save an instrument that this is truly one of a kind.

And he's barely making ends meet as a single father of two teenage daughters who are dealing with health and boyfriend issues.

Amid this backdrop Andrei Bowden-Schwartz and Sam B. Jones spend time with Burns, his daughters, friends, and fellow mudding enthusiasts, as his searches for a new place to experience the purity of mudding without rules or admission yields to blocked roads, trespassing warnings, and rising land values in this fast-growing region. Burns begrudgingly decides to check out the Redneck Yacht Club, South Florida's pay-to-play mudding bastion of outrageous, pre-purgatory mix of drinking, twerking, bare skin, and lots and lots of mudan excursion that forces Burns to re-examine his life. This jaw-dropping and unapologetic immersion into Florida's redneck mudding culture lives up to its title, but it also follows one man's decision to finally accept change and re-adjust his priorities.

Years later, **Chairman Cao Dewang**, CEO of the Chinese company Fuyao Glass, opens an American wing of his sprawling, multi-billion-dollar company in that very same plant, hiring thousands of Dayton locals and kicking off one of the strangest tales of international labor and cross-cultural contact committed to screen.

Julia Reichert and Steven Bognar's American Factory is a wry look at what happens when America's economic vulnerability comes toe-to-toe with a new era of ambitious Chinese expansion. It's a tale threaded through with cinema verite scenes of union meetings and management pow-wows, and on and on, until what emerges is a difficult, often funny, but altogether urgent look at the future of labor. An unsettling question hangs over the company and the story: Will America's Fuyao Glass employees succeed in unionizing?

How and why, and whether the upper management is able to do anything to stop it, serve as the backbone for *American Factory*. It's a bit of everyday political drama that has implications, not only for these workers' lives, but for how we come to understand the broader disconnects between laborer and boss—and by extension, America and China.

Driveways is the second film from *Spa Night* director **Andrew Ahn**. It's a beautifully observed, bittersweet drama about how the search for a sense of community knows no age limit.

Yes, you read that right: Strickland's subterranean deadpan odyssey centers its narrative around an eerie department store equal parts **David Lynch** and **Dario Argento**, as unsuspecting clients purchase cursed outfits that lead to supernatural horrors that defy any rational explanation—even as they take on dreamlike specificity in Strickland's homegrown universe.

His distinctive lineup includes a middle-aged single mother (Secrets & Lies star Marianne Jean-Baptiste) whose dating life takes a series of odd turns, and a clueless washing machine repairman (Leo Bill). All of these would-be victims operate at the whims of a deranged saleswoman (Fatma Mohamed) as the movie winds toward a mesmerizing climax that suggests Lost Highway folded into the Italian giallo tradition. Strickland's command over disorienting audiovisual tapestries reaches new heights of sophistication in this hypnotic and wondrous head trip.

But then they discover a liberating, mysterious world of art, drugs, and sex amid the underground clubs of Mexico City.

Hari Sama's electrifying coming-of-age tale doesn't take the traditional route for this type of story. Rather, the film eventually comes to embody the anarchic, hedonistic spirit of experimental post-punk excess-transforming into a kaleidoscopic portrait of avant-garde art, direct-action protest, queer awakening, and the dizzying, dangerous freedom of a world seemingly without rules. It's the age of AIDS, and right-wing conformism, but the film is neither cautionary tale nor nostalgia trip. Anchored by marvelous performances from its young cast, and Sama's assured, inventive sense of style, it's a picture suffused in both historical perspective and a forward-looking sense of the possible.

When Zadie agrees to travel with the couple to her mother's (**Kym Whitley**) bed and breakfast for a weekend getaway, disaster seems like it could be imminent. But instead, especially after the arrival of handsome solo traveler Aubrey (**Y'lan Noel**), it begins to feel like maybe third-wheeling it was the best idea Zadie ever had. Writer and director **Stella Meghie** (*Jean Of The Joneses*; *Everything*, *Everything*) has crafted a warm, wry third feature that not only deftly weaves together comedy and romance in an intimate setting, but that also provides a glorious showcase for its former *Saturday Night Live* star lead.

Cooper is a multifaceted creative who trespasses into Berlin's U-Banh to shoot an illegal graffiti art attack. The film is a kaleidoscopic record of her kinetic output. Although adored by countless fans of her graffiti books that include American b-boys and younger European taggers, *Martha: A Picture Story* also functions as testament to a female artist who broke new pictorial ground highlighting a grassroots art movement that was later embraced by mainstream culture, while remaining steadfast to be recognized on as more than just a graffiti photographer.

The Projectionist

For much of the last half century, Cyprus-born theater operator **Nick Nicolaou** has lived and breathed the world of New York City cinema. Starting with the Times Square adult film houses of the 1970's and moving through decades of forced change at the hands of city regulation, chain takeovers, and vast cultural shifts, Nicolaou now exists as one of the last truly independent theater owners left standing, as he works to keep his low-cost theaters alive in an industry aiming to push them out.

Returning to the city for his first New York-set documentary in nearly a decade, **Abel Ferrara** traces both the story of Nicolaou's life and the changing city that it reflects, from the cleansing of Times Square to the fight for survival of the outer boroughs' few remaining neighborhood theaters. The result is a charmingly off-the-cuff odyssey through the history of film exhibition, New York, and the long-standing intersection of the two.

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

Bliss

Known for her dark and macabre artwork, painter Dezzy Donahue (Dora Madison) is in a professional rut. Unable to finish her newest commissioned work, Dezzy looks to reignite her creative juices by letting loose—as in, taking every drug in sight and tearing through raucous house parties and heavy metal bars. After a few nights spent with her debauchery-loving friends Courtney (Tru Collins) and Ronnie (Rhys Wakefield), though, Dezzy notices changes within herself. On the positive side, she's finally painting again, but she's also developing a strange desire for blood. As someone who has never been able to control her vices in the first place, Dezzy is quickly and violently consumed by this bloodlust.

With his previous films, Almost Human (2013) and The Mind's Eye (2015), filmmaker Joe Begos won the hearts of horror lovers through his stylistic nostalgia and inhibition-free penchant for brutality. Upping the ante, Bliss roars with searing visuals, kinetic energy, an endearing nastiness, and a ferociously all-in lead performance from Madison. Although it's set in modern-day Los Angeles, Bliss harkens back to the grimy days of New York City grindhouse cinema, when films like Abel Ferrara's The Driller Killer and Bill Lustig's Maniac were the norm.

Norval's (Elijah Wood) life has been, to put it lightly, difficult. Currently living home with his mother, the troubled young man is coming off alcohol-related struggles and a suicide attempt. So when he receives an unexpected letter from his estranged father requesting a visit, Norval catches a bus up to his dad's secluded and scenic waterfront home. Maybe reconnecting with his father will give Norval the emotional fulfillment he's been lacking. Before long, though, he notices something off about his dad, an uneasy feeling triggered by inappropriate comments and a possible over-dependence on booze. Norval quickly realizes that his hope of father/son bonding is doomed. Instead of a family reunion, he finds himself in waking nightmare.

After years behind the scenes producing genre fare like *The ABCs Of Death* and *The Greasy Strangler*, Kiwi filmmaker **Ant Timpson** makes his directorial debut with *Come To Daddy*, a twisty genre-bender that's as unclassifiable as it is entertaining. Written by *The Greasy Strangler* co-scribe **Toby Harvard**, this alternately funny and sinister mystery box of a film retains that notorious cult favorite's unpredictability yet is firmly grounded by Wood's terrific "breaking badass" lead performance.

Knives and Skin

Surreal forces lurk behind the fluorescent facade of an unassuming Midwestern town in Jennifer Reeder's hyper-stylized Knives And Skin. Sophomore year of high school is upended when Carolyn Harper (Raven Whitley) suddenly vanishes after being abandoned at the lake by her jock boyfriend (Ty Olwin). In the wake of Carolyn's mysterious disappearance, a dark abyss widens among the inhabitants of Big River as the ripples of anxiety and mistrust begin to permeate through the high school halls and beyond. In a series of intertwined suburban vignettes, fear and loss cause the members of Carolyn's inner-circle to develop unexpected and desperate coping strategies as they slowly begin to unravel under the impact of their grief and suspicions.

Neon-drenched cinematography, moody synthesizers, and acapella renditions of 80s pop hits are the foundations of this feminist teen noir that evokes the surreal dreamscape of *Twin Peaks* and the mean-girl existential malaise of *Heathers*. In Reeder's uncanny exploration of communal trauma, where young women have magic powers and disheveled clowns have the ability to reanimate corpses, small-town mentality is presented as something bordering on psychosis.

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
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Something Else

In 2012, the indie horror world met **Jeremy Gardner** via *The Battery*, the writer/director/
actor's lo-fi and brilliantly executed buddy

You Don't Nomi

DIRECTED BY JEFFREY MCHALE

When it was released in 1995, **Paul Verhoeven**'s *Showgirls* was reviled. The first NC-17 release to receive a wide theatrical release, the public and critics of the era—with a loud, clear, collective voice—rejected the film. It was nominated for a record 13 Razzie Awards, and won a then-record seven. **Roger Ebert**, in one of the more generous reviews the film received, summed his opinion up by noting that, "the film is not, in short, quite unredeemably bad."

But Showgirls' reputation has been resuscitated in the intervening 24 years, and conceding one's admiration for Nomi Malone's sordid tale is no longer the admission of questionable taste it once signified. You Don't Nomi brilliantly draws on archival footage of Showgirls' production, revealing interviews with the major players, and surprisingly thoughtful conversations with the cinephiles who are leading the charge in the film's redemptive journey from a notorious flop to cult classic. Is it a masterpiece? Or is it a piece of shit? Jeffrey McHale's addictive documentary argues for a third designation: the masterpiece of shit.

An unexpected hit, the show catapulted Westheimer into an unlikely celebrity career, where she promoted a positive and transparent dialogue around sex and revolutionized the way people understand sexuality. But even after helping so many others, few know Westheimer's own story. Born in 1928 in Germany as the only child of Orthodox Jews, Dr. Ruth escaped the Holocaust as a child, eventually emigrating to the United States in the 1950s. Her own experiences with love, sex, and loss are revealed to have shaped the distinctive character we all know today.

Ryan White's (*The Keepers, Good Ol' Freda*) affectionate bio-doc showcases Dr. Ruth's indelible charm and no-nonsense approach to her life's work, while also exposing a more vulnerable side to the legendary sex therapist. Now approaching 91, Dr. Ruth reflects on her own painful past and unlikely path to a career at the forefront of the sexual revolution.



Each subject undergoes experimental brain interface treatment, which involves direct stimulation from surgically inserted electrodes. Progress is slow but the picture is clear: as disease and disabilities fuel innovation and expanded capabilities, the ethical quandaries of a cognitive revolution are imminent.

With incredible access and thoughtful probing, filmmakers **Taryn Southern** and **Elena Gaby** unpack the complexities of this emerging field in technology. From covert government operations and questions of regulation to the philosophy behind our sense of self, *I AM HUMAN* charts the real world possibilities of melding artificial and human intelligence.


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Inna De Yard: The Soul of Jamaica

While Bob Marley may be most closely associated with the heyday of reggae music, there are others who did not achieve international stardom, ones who remain popular in Jamaica and among reggae fans, singers and songwriters who maintain the spiritual and social values reflected in their music from the 70s and 80s. Now they will once again sing about those values, as relevant as ever, on an international tour. *Inna de Yard* captures the musicians—among them Ken Boothe, Winston McAnuff, Kiddus I, and Cedric Myton—as they reacquaint, swap stories, and talk of their lives as they rehearse in a studio in the hills above Kingston in a house adorned with hundreds of old LPs and 45s from back in the day.

Director **Peter Webber** spends time with them individually—also getting thoughts from singer **Judy Mowatt**—and it is clear the joyous, infectious music they are about to perform is much more than some sort of nostalgia trip. *Inna de Yard* captures the ongoing relevance of reggae, social values, and the music's passion to revitalize an older generation while passing it on to younger listeners.

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

LINDA RONSTADT: The Sound of My Voice

With one of the most memorably stunning voices that has ever hit the airwayes. Linda Ronstadt burst onto the 1960s folk rock music scene in her early twenties. The lead singer of the Stone Poneys, Ronstadt eventually branched out to begin her decades long career as a solo artist, touring the world selling out stadiums and, at one point, setting the record as the highest paid female artist in rock. Most remarkable to this day is her interest in and willingness to jump into new and challenging styles of music, including opera, jazz, and Mexican folk, excelling fantastically with each. Ronstadt has also been an outspoken political advocate for causes such as same-sex marriage and the inhumane treatment of undocumented immigrants, never shying away from fighting for what she believes both on and off the stage.

Filled with rare photos from her childhood in Tucson and wonderful archival footage from her iconic performances, as well as moving testimonials by luminaries like Emmylou Harris, Dolly Parton and Bonnie Raitt, Ronstadt's own voice narrates her journey all the way to her retirement in 2011 due to Parkinson's disease. In the deft hands of directors Rob Epstein and Jeffrey Friedman and producers James Keach and Michele Farinola, we are treated to a poignant biopic about a truly one of-akind artist.

When his loving adoptive parents (**Naomi Watts** and **Tim Roth**) become entangled in the suspicions of this teacher, complex questions of prejudice suddenly bubble to the surface, threatening to expose the ugly truths about all involved.

Boasting a revelatory central performance by Harrison (who also appears this year in *Gully*) and nuanced work from an electrifying ensemble, director and co-writer **Julius Onah** twists this tale (adapted with **JC Lee** from his own play) into unexpected shapes, forcing the audience to examine the characters from every imaginable angle. Tension pulls at the screen, allegiances shift, and the viewer's own biases are used to deepen the storytelling in masterful ways.

As the eighth and final leader of the Soviet Union, **Mikhail Gorbachev** is a figure equally defined by the vision of transparency that led his efforts to expand and restructure his nation, and the lost potential left in the wake of the USSR's disintegration. Now nearly three decades since his removal from power, the 87-year-old Gorbachev sits down with legendary filmmaker **Werner Herzog** for a wide-spanning conversation on his life and legacy, at a time when the former President finds himself more removed than ever from the defining ideologies of Russian leadership.

Teaming up with frequent collaborator **Andre Singer** and filmed over the course of six months, Herzog approaches his subject with equal parts admiration and pity. As the duo explore the conditions of Gorbachev's unlikely rise to power through a surprisingly candid and friendly rapport, Herzog's ever-present themes soon emerge, as the director shapes a timely portrait of the absurdly unstable and temporal nature of those in the world's most powerful positions.

Slay the Dragon

Gerrymandering has been a popular topic recently, and for good reason. Beyond the blatant political interests fueling the practice, gerrymandering has led to an erosion of democracy, a disregard for the voter, and without it various events in the past years would not have been pulled off. Slay the Dragon draws direct connections between this practice and the Flint water crisis, Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker's removal of collective bargaining for public employees, bathroom bills, racism, and voter ID laws.

We learn about packing and cracking and witness creative redistricting lines full of twists, curves, and squiggles to guarantee a certain majority. But we also experience hope in the form of Katie Fahey, a Michigander who forms the group Voters Not Politicians working to bring a measure onto the state's ballot to require an independent group—not the legislature—to draw the lines. And in Wisconsin, an activist group challenges the state's redistricting in a case that makes its way to the US Supreme Court. Directors Barak Goodman and Chris Durrance crafts a detailed, maddening, ultimately inspiring look—deftly balancing the facts and maps with the tireless work of people like Fahey to get us to act to ensure that democracy will survive.



XY Chelsea

How did a war in Iraq founded on deception end up with the court marshall of the truth teller? This question frames XY Chelsea, a documentary set in the aftermath of the release from prison of Chelsea Manning, a former U.S. Army soldier and intelligence analyst convicted of violating the Espionage Act in 2013, after leaking classified U.S. documents to WikiLeaks. Manning's information revealed illegal practices—such as torture and abuse of detainees and the unreported deaths of over 15,000 civilians—engaged by the U.S. military.

While imprisoned, Manning, a trans woman, also began to transition medically. The film offers insight to her motivations for whistleblowing, and ultimately, for taking on the U.S. government. What is seemingly a portrait of a polarizing figure in recent American history also doubles for the blueprint on how patriotic Americans can resist an unlawful ruler.
